## **General Climate Characteristics**

### Upper Thailand (Northern, Northeastern, Central and Eastern parts of Thailand):

During April: Heat low pressure air masses still cover over the upper Thailand from time to time. Additionally, some southerly or southeasterly winds prevail to cover the area almost all of this month. These cause the upper Thailand to have sweltering weather generally with very hot air in some areas on some days. Maximum temperatures are about 42 – 43 C. Alternatively thunder rains occur in many areas, thus reducing some heat. Then during the first half of May: Being the transition time from the summer to the rainy seasons, weather will be variable. Thus, sweltering weather and thunder rains occur in some areas. From the second half of May until June: Southwest monsoon will prevail to cover Thailand as being rather active continuously during some periods. Thus, the upper Thailand will have more abundant rainfall with heavy to very heavy rains in some areas.

The summarized rains will be slightly below normal, while most average temperatures will be slightly above normal

### Southern Thailand

During April: Some easterly or southeasterly winds still prevail to cover the Gulf of Thailand and the southern Thailand almost all of this period. This causes the southern to have isolated to widely scattered rainfall with hot air on some days, while waves in the Gulf of Thailand and the Andaman Sea will be about 1 meter high. Then during May until June: The southwest monsoon will prevail to cover the Andaman Sea and the southern Thailand. Thus, the southern will have more amount and distribution of rainfall especially around the western coast. Additionally, some heavy rains occur in some areas. Also, wind wave in the Andaman Sea will strengthen with about 2 – 3 meters height.

The summarized rains will be below normal, while average temperatures will be slightly above normal.

#### \*\*\* <u>Cautions:</u> \*\*\*

<u>During April</u>: Summer thunderstorms happen often with thunder rains, gusty winds, and possible hails in some areas. Thus, some damages of buildings and farms possibly occur.

<u>During May:</u> Low pressure air masses occur at the Andaman Sea and may strengthen to be depressions toward cyclones. Their movements are toward the north to the east and may be near the western side of Thailand. Thus, the western side of the northern and central parts of Thailand including with the southern part will have more rainfall.

<u>During June</u>: Tropical cyclones often develop in the Western Pacific, and may possibly move toward the Philippines to the South China Sea. Thus, the southwest monsoon covering Thailand and the Gulf of Thailand will be more active causing Thailand to have more rainfall especially at the coastal areas of the eastern part and the southern Thailand (west coast).
